
I am sure this bunch of activities has rejuvenated every member surgeon of our state.

It is our proud privilege to honour a towering figure in the world of surgery — **Dr. Braj Nandan Singh Bhonsle**, a name synonymous with surgical excellence and academic integrity.

Dr. Bhonsle completed his MBBS in 1953 and his MS in General Surgery in 1956 — a time when few dared to take the path he chose with such clarity and conviction. He went on to earn the prestigious FRCS (England) in 1959, marking him as one of the few surgeons from India at the time to be recognized internationally.

In 1962, he joined Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences (RIMS) — then RMCH — and what followed was over two and a half decades of unwavering dedication to surgical education, clinical brilliance, and mentorship. He served the nation and its institutions with grace and intellect until his retirement in 1988. To this day, his legacy lives on in the countless students he has trained, the patients he has healed, and the standards he has set for generations to follow.

We are deeply honored to celebrate the life and work of a true stalwart of Indian surgery.





